History: - the seven days of the week (where the names come from).  
Include a brief description of each.

Geography: - the seven ancient wonders of the world } what they are, who  
} built them and when,  
- the seven modern wonders of the world } location, and any  
} other interesting  
- the seven natural wonders of the world } facts.

- the seven oceans AND the seven continents of the world.  
Include at least one major natural feature for each continent eg  
mountain, lake, desert, forest, falls, rock  
formations. Survey which continent people would most like to  
visit, and present your findings.

Literature: - the seven deadly sins (name them). Include definitions and  
where they came from.

Science: - the seven rainbow colours (name them). Draw a diagram of  
a simple science experiment that will show the seven colours.

Media: - the seven von Trapp children from the movie 'The Sound of  
Music'. Name the real family, and the actors/actresses.  
Did any go on to be famous? Are any still alive?

- the seven dwarfs from the movie 'Snow White and the Seven  
Dwarfs (animation). Name the dwarfs and their character  
trait. Name the people who did their voices. Survey which  
dwarf is people's favourite, and present findings.

- the seven brothers' names in the movie 'Seven Brides for  
Seven Brothers' (musical) and their seven brides' names.  
1. The classic movie and the brides  
2. The modern TV series. Which is the most famous  
actor? What else has he featured in?

Music: - the seven musical notes (classic AND sol-fa system). Label  
notes on a musical staff/stave. Invent a mnemonic  
(memory helper) to help remember the notes in order.  
Who invented the sol-fa system, and why? What is the  
song from 'The Sound of Music' that is a mnemonic for  
this system?

Sport: - the seven netball playing positions. Name them, state their  
purpose/job. Draw a diagram of a court showing areas  
each position is allowed in.
